Brian K. Daines, MD earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Biochemistry from Brigham Young University in Provo, Utah, and his medical degree from the Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons in New York. He continued his training with a Surgical Residency in the Department of Orthopaedic Surgery at the University of Washington in Seattle. Dr. Daines then completed a Joint Reconstructive Surgery Fellowship at Colorado Joint Replacement in Denver.

Dr. Daines maintains an active interest in orthopaedic research. While a fellow with Dr. Doug A. Dennis, he was involved in several book chapters and publications on bone loss in revision knee replacements, acetabula component position, and blood management in joint replacements. He is actively involved in Operation Walk, a national program that provides joint replacements to underserved people internationally, as well as here in the United States. He recently returned from a trip to Panama where he was part of a team that performed 72 joint replacements and he plans to return soon.

Dr. Daines enjoys orthopaedics and the opportunity to help people return to an active lifestyle. He is dedicating his life to the study of hip and knee arthritis and looks forward to serving the Southern Illinois community.
