On behalf of the more than 54 million Americans with doctor-diagnosed arthritis in the United States, the Arthritis Foundation writes in support of the bipartisan Legacy IRA Act (S. 1257 / H.R. 3832), which builds on and expands upon the existing Individual Retirement Account (IRA) Charitable Rollover and allows individuals age 65 and older to make tax-free IRA rollovers to charitable organizations through life-income plans.

The Arthritis Foundation is a community-driven organization powered by a strong network of volunteers and fearless advocates. As the country works to stem the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19), the Arthritis Foundation is a lifeline for people with arthritis seeking help, support, and answers during this difficult time. Many organizations have been and will be significantly harmed by reduced charitable giving, travel restrictions, fundraising event cancellations, and reduced meeting attendance as a result of COVID-19; the Arthritis Foundation has already been severely impacted across all of these areas. The Legacy IRA Act would provide seniors with another giving option by allowing them to use their IRA to fund a gift annuity. In other words, seniors with IRA resources, regardless of itemizing status, will benefit from this charitable giving incentive.
