



## Washington, D.C.: Why Arthritis Matters

Arthritis affects **16.9%** of the population in Washington, D.C.. That's **101,000** adults living with doctor-diagnosed arthritis in the state.

- There are over **54 Million** American adults with doctor diagnosed arthritis in the U.S.
- **1** in 3 veterans has arthritis, which accounts for **10.3%** of the people in Washington, D.C. living with arthritis
- There are approximately **300,000 kids** with arthritis in the U.S. but only about **390 pediatric rheumatologists.** That's about 700 kids for each doctor.

## Over 24 million Americans experience activity limitations due to their arthritis.

- **54,000** adults in Washington, D.C. have activity limitations caused by arthritis
- Among all adults in Washington, D.C. with arthritis, 51.6% have work limitations
- Arthritis in the U.S. has an economic burden of \$304 billion made up of medical expenses and lost wages

## Adults with arthritis often have one or more chronic conditions.

- Mental Health: Anxiety and depression affect 1/3 of U.S. adults with arthritis 45 years of age or older
- **Diabetes: 45.9%** of adults in DC with diabetes also have arthritis
- Heart Disease: 45.4% of adults in DC with heart disease also have arthritis
- **Obesity: 30.4%** of adults in DC who are obese also have arthritis

## You can make a difference by advocating for state and federal legislation that will help people with arthritis in Washington. Legislative priorities for 2019 include:

- Market Stabilization: State strategies to make health insurance more affordable and adequate on the individual exchange
- Congressional Arthritis Caucus: Grows the bipartisan Congressional Arthritis Caucus, a forum to educate Members of Congress about the most pressing issues facing people with arthritis
