He and his younger brother Nick are wrestling fanatics and spend many long hours imitating their favorite moves. Several weeks later when accompanying Nick to the doctor, Evan asked to have his arm looked at because he had been experiencing so much pain. The doctor suspected a sprain and ordered an x-ray and gave Evan a shoulder brace. Still finding no relief, Evan began to even write left-handed to avoid any movement of his right arm. It was at this point that he was taken to a specialist. An MRI was ordered which revealed Evan's condition; Juvenile Idiopathic Arthritis (JIA).

Evan was thrust into a world of hospital visits, injections and medications. He has been on Methotrexate for the last year and a half and he is doing extremely well. He has been pain free and has experienced no flare ups in the last eight months.
